EVROS / JUNIOR ACHIEVERS IRELAND

The school's new partnership with Evros
Technology Group has been an outstanding
success. All of the Transition Year students have
taken part in the first phase of the programme.
This involved a Launch Day at the Evros site in
Cherrywood, and two follow-up workshops at the
school called 'Marketing Myself' and 'Building A
Team'. Twenty Evros volunteers facilitated these
high-energy, interactive sessions.



Twenty shortlisted students will now work in teams with five Evros engineers on an **app development** project during second term. This will culminate in a 'Dragons' Den' event in March. All TY students involved will receive certification from **Junior Achievers Ireland (JAI)**.

EMBED PROGRAMME

The EMBED programme has gone from strength to strength. **Dr Daniel Crean**, through the **UCD Access Office**, has been working with the 6th Year students since early September.

The programme is in its pilot stage, and is unique to St Kilian's. It involves large and small group discussions covering areas such as **ambition**, **goalsetting**, **commitment** and **study skills**.
